The Institute of Power Engineers is a professional organization made up of Power Engineers and people working in related fields. Power Engineering, also known as Stationary Engineering, was one of the first compulsory licensing occupations established. From its inception, the Institute has been the unified voice of Power Engineers across Canada.

Objective

- To promote business relations, social activities, and mutual understanding among Power Engineers.
- To protect the interests and to assist in the advancement of the members.
- To co-operate, in the interests of the profession with other Technical Associations and with Municipal, Provincial, and Federal authorities.
- To formulate and promote a professional Code of Ethics.
- To assist Power Engineers in the performance of their technical and civil duties.

The Institute of Power Engineers is a national organization with Branches in most provinces. Our website contains a newsletter section containing information concerning the profession. Topics may cover issues such as current events, legislation, technology, and education.
